Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on 13 November 2018.

At 7.30pm in Almscliffe Hall.

The Chairman welcomed Councillors and residents.

Declaration of interest K.Clark on item 7a.

Minutes of last Meeting held on 11 September having been circulated were taken as read as being a true record of that meeting, proposed by H.Bosworth and seconded by P.Jagger.

Outstanding items

Drain under Weeton Railway Bridge. C. Trotter advised that the drain cleaner was unable to clear the drain as it was completely blocked. Contractors will be sought to reposition the drain but this will involve closing the road. A traffic order will be made to close the road and the Council will be informed.

Book exchange is now fully operational, however the funds from NYCC will not be available for this project because it has already been started. However the funds can be diverted to another project that will require two quotes.

AED Defibrillator at Weeton Station Car Park. No approval for funding.

New pads required for Almscliffe Hall Defibrillator, approved. Costs £47.50 for 2 years.

Neighbourhood Watch. A meeting with the Police has taken place and the information was supplied about communication where a whats.app. links to the Police and Clare Barley is our representative. A suggestion that Neighbourhood Watch Signs be obtained and located . A report will appear in the Parish News.

Temporary Lights for utilities work. C.Trotter is to discuss with the Head of Highways. P.Jagger requested that D.Needham should be thanked for all his dedicated work as Chairman of the Parish Council. B.Wilyman is to register an article for the next Parish News.

Speed watch report last reading 36 offence in 30 minutes. Councillors are awaiting a response from NYCC Highways regarding the Speed Watch signs.

Use of the redundant coal yard and complaints about the ticket machine location.

GDPR P Jagger agreed to investigate the legal obligations and the security of information for the next meeting.

Parish Plan

P.Jagger reported that the questionnaire will be delivered to the village in January 2019 to be completed by the middle of February. The grant from NYCC has been received but the lottery grant funding was turned down.
